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Executive summary

The community of NSAGGU is infamous. Located in WAKISO District of Uganda, the little village has had the profound misfortune of being the center of kampa-la's khat growing base, poverty, disease, and poor education infra-structures that lead to delayed development and ultimately to the rest of Uganda. These three prospective years from 2020 are particularly going to be hard for this community due to the political instability the whole country is going through and the in approximate time of recovery

Heart For The Nations International (HRTNI) has been

working with the community of Nsaggu in partnership with Destiny Doctors- Uganda and Amen and Amen church in the previous year 2019 to empower

This year 2020 we saw close to 750 patients in a total of four days who all received free consultations with doctors, medical treatment, health education with up to date information and gospel preaching

Project Vision & Goals

The heart for the nations international medical outreach to Uganda 2020 , Nsaggu community was conducted in line with the ministry of health-Uganda community health promotion strategy 2020 and the Destiny Doctors' Community Health Empowerment project (CHE) which all share a common ground

which is reaching out to these underserved seemingly non- existent communities, and promoting health. The outreach comprised of a number of services over a week's period all aimed at extending the love of our Christ through;

The outreach



The outreach

The medical outreach started with purchase of drugs from the different pharmaceutical importers with in Uganda on Monday, drugs and sundries were bought from 3 different companies due to their relative varying prices. Destiny doctors provided the health human resource while the church provided the support staff, HFTNI provided both staffs and sponsored the whole outreach, on Tuesday

the clinic started, seven consultation stations were set where the patients would interact with the doctors and one room for privacy, on station for laboratory and one station acted as the pharmacy where those that had been prescribed drugs received them free of charge, a counsellor was set a side for those that needed one, then a big station was set for health education which was coordinated by

Bindhya and Sandhya of HFTNI, this was the most crucial bit of the outreach. A waiting station was set outside in the tent where patients first rested from the long distances as they were being preached to by a team led by Pr. Ricky Brezezicki.

Results & analysis

The clinic saw 750 patients with 706 receiving free drugs from our pharmacy, more than 70% (570 of the total patients) that saw our clinic were females and the rest being males, 32% of the patients were beyond 45years old and 34% of the patients are unemployed. Most of them are farmers and less than 5% have formal jobs. 56% of the patients had infectious diseases

and 40 % had non communicable disease, of these 20% had both an infectious and non communicable illness. 317 patients received blood check ups which included malaria, random blood sugar test, typhoid, HCG, HIV. Of these 192 tested for hiv where 94 of these were on request.

More services were offered by both our general and specialized stations such as; general

medicine, peadiatrics, ophthalmology, ENT, and psychiatry. The results show a relative increase in the number of non communicable diseases compared to the 14% registered in the 2019 report. Patients with critical and chronic cases were referred to the near by public hospital. We also registered 28 people who gave their lives to Christ and were invited to fellowship with the church

Partnerships

HFTNI partnered with both regional and national service providers to ensure a holistic approach to the community’s health.

Ministry of health Uganda

This was a partnership bridged by destiny doctors as the MOH issued us with a license that permitted us to carry out the outreach under the current medical guidelines that Uganda is following. It provided points of referral for our patients that needed continuous care. The ministry has also

received a copy of our data to help in policy making and planning for this community.

DESTINY DOCTORS

This is a volunteership led organization of all people that identify themselves as being called to serve, they provided the medical staffing and covering medical licenses that were needed and crucial to this medical outreach. They do these outreaches under their broad project; The Community Health Empowerment project which strategizes more on

health education and restoring power over health to communities

AMEN AND AMEN CHURCH

This is a church in the heart of the community we served. It hosted us and provided all the non skilled labour, interpreters . The people that gave their lives to Christ will continuously fellowship with this church

Achievements

- * Successful completion of a one week clinic that led to treatment of over 750 patients
- * 28 souls gave their lives to Christ and others started on their journey to make this choice

challenges

- ⇒ **Medical under-stock,** well ,it is so heart breaking to want to give but you have nothing to give, the situation is even more serious when it involves basic needs such as a right to good health. We make this outreach with support of all our sponsors and all those that give to the cause, what you would consider less to you actually constitutes someone’s full treatment that saves their life, therefore we are always limited in stock and medicines because of resources and therefore we can say that we treated all people who came by our clinic, some came and the drugs they needed were not stocked, we therefore pray that we are able to do a little more with God by our side
- ⇒ **Uncontrolled health indicators,** such as the fact that most of the natives are commercial khat growers which predisposes them to a number of medical and psychiatric conditions that may not be fully manageable within a short time, this calls for a permanent interve-
